Marine Life Taking Flight in the Skies at the Second Edition of Tamil Nadu Kite Festival



The second edition of the Tamil Nadu International Kite Festival, organised by the Tourism Department in association with Global Media Box took place in two locations, Kanniyakumari and Mamallapuram.

The event showcased approximately 200 kites from eight countries includina Malaysia, Vietnam Thailand. China, USA. France. Singapore and India centred around the theme "Save Marine Life, Save Mother Earth."The prelude to the festival was conducted for three days in Kanniyakumari from August 4th to August 6th. Thiru T. Mano Thangaraj, the Hon'ble Minister of Milk and Dairy Development of Tamil Nadu inaugurated the event.

Destination of the Month

Fort St.George



The majestic white structure rises high along the Bay of Bengal coast in Chennai has a rich history reflecting both the city of Madras and the colonial history of India

Fort St. George was the first English fortification in India, built between 1639 and 1640 CE. After negotiating with the Raja of Chandragiri, Francis Day and Andrew Cogan (the first agent of the English East India Company to rule Madras) acquired the strip of land on the Coromandel coast. The construction of the fort was completed on St. George's Day, April 23, 1644, which led to its christening in honour of this occasion.

Flag Staff

The flagstaff at Fort St. George is an important reminder of British rule in India. It has stood tall since 1688 CE and is one of the tallest in the country, reaching a height of 148 feet. This flagstaff was originally part of a ship's mast, made from a single piece of teakwood. On August 15, 1947, symbolising the culmination of British rule in India, the Indian tricolour was raised high on this flagstaff.



Fort Museum



The Fort Museum houses a collection of artefacts from the three centuries of British presence in India, showcasing them in ten galleries spread across three floors. These galleries include the Porcelain, Portrait, and Indo-French Galleries.

Among the noteworthy installations, on this premises are the marble statue of Lord Cornwallis and the flag that flew on August 15, 1947, marking India's independence.
